

Street Action in New Belgrade as Part of the International Campaign “16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence”

During December, as part of the international campaign “16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence,” representatives of the Victimology Society of Serbia carried out a street action involving direct conversations with citizens in the municipality of New Belgrade. The activities were conducted at three different locations: the Municipal Service Hall of New Belgrade, the Gazela Local Community, and the Stari Aerodrom Local Community.



At these locations, citizens had the opportunity to speak with VDS representatives about the importance of marking the 16 Days of Activism, as well as about the activities and services provided by the Victimology Society of Serbia. Special attention was devoted to informing the public about available support services for victims of violence and encouraging the community to recognize early signs of violence and respond responsibly.



Informational materials containing key information about VDS services and contact details were also distributed during the action.

The goal of this activity was to ensure that as many citizens as possible become aware of the importance of responding to violence, the available support mechanisms, and to encourage conversations about violence prevention and empowerment to seek help.



The street action in New Belgrade demonstrated that direct communication with citizens is extremely important for raising awareness about recognizing and reporting violence.
